Encourage her to attend any workshops scheduled for chapter presidents at your state organization convention or conference as well as any she might find helpful at the international convention. TREASURERS' TIPS

ith the dues portal now open, you have access to update all members' addresses and email addresses. Just enter the portal and go to Member Management and click on the member and make your changes. Be sure to hit Save when done.

Remember that all members who join are paying dues for 2022-2023 dues year and the join date is the date they pay dues to you and not the date of the induction ceremony. Member benefits begin as soon as you enter them into the dues portal with a valid email address. We can then provide them with the credentials from HQ to log onto the DKG website.

As you mark each member as paid in the portal, please verify their address and email and their desire to receive the publications (DKG NEWS and Collegial Exchange) electronically or as a hard copy in the member management section of the portal. All new members receive all publications by mail for the first year of their membership. Look for these two boxes on the bottom of each member's information in member management.

Bucket List: International Convention

Vears ago, when I first became a DKG member, I would hear announcements and "first timers" speeches about the international conventions. I always thought to myself, "I'll attend one day. It's on my bucket list." Then in 2014, I finally took the leap and decided to attend the International Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana. That leap propelled me into a whole new world of the Society.

I was excited about the trip for many reasons. I was born in Indiana but grew up in Hawai'i. 2014 would be exactly 30 years since I last visited Indiana. My memories of Indiana were of red covered bridges, huge cornfields, and miles of open space. Was I in for a big surprise!

The convention was five days from July 28th to August 1st. On the last day of the convention, my Hawai'i State Mu Chapter sister, Ellen Tanoura asked me, "How would you describe your experience in one word?" There was so much. I couldn't think of just one word. After a long silence she said, "Okay...how about a phrase?" I came up with BEYOND MY EXPECTATIONS.

Indiana

First, the trip was 'beyond my expectations' because I got to see Indiana and a little bit of my family history. I was born in Indiana and attended high school there 30 years prior. I had not been back since. When I got there, I found some things had not changed. The hospital I was once a patient in was still there, just a few blocks from the convention hotel. The State Capitol, still beautiful. But I was pleased to see that the city was changing; lots of development and diversity. My DKG sisters and I explored the city through the underground tunnels that connected our hotel to the city. There was so much to see and do in Indianapolis that we could've used another week there.

Next was the convention. This was my first DKG International Convention. I knew it was going to be big and Patti Jenks, state president at the time, did a great job of preparing me for what to expect. But I was still blown away with the enormity of everything. I had a hint of how large it would be when we landed and there was a DKG reception table at the airport baggage claim. Then there were the signs throughout the city that read, "Indy welcomes DKG". But the magnitude of the convention did not hit me until I walked into the main ballroom on the first night and saw over 1200 women from all over the world. On Tuesday morning, it was reinforced again at the general business meeting during roll call. I got to hear all the countries represented from Guatemala to the Netherlands to the ladies sitting right in front of us from Iceland. This was truly INTERNATIONAL. As we went over the amendments at the Wednesday general session meeting, I looked around the ballroom and thought, "All these women; all these cultures and languages; and we all belong to the same society with the same mission." Amazing.

Finally, there was getting to know my DKG sisters. I attended the convention, expecting to learn more about the society and governance at the international level. I did not expect to make so many connections across the society. I met teachers from other countries in the elevator rides, at general sessions, even waiting in lines. While waiting for my rental car, I even met an Indiana music teacher that went to college in the small town of Greencastle, west of Indianapolis, where my high school was located. However, I think the best part of the trip was getting to know my Hawai'i State sisters. I've met members from other chapters at service projects, meetings and workshops over the years. However, at the convention, we had meals together, attended breakout sessions, and of course shopped. I felt I really had an opportunity to spend quality time with Hawai'i State members and as a result, we left feeling like true SISTERS.

DKG sisters – The upcoming 2022 New Orleans Convention is your opportunity to attend an international convention. This is the first in-person DKG International Convention in four years. What better time than now for YOU to take the leap. For many years, I listened to the 'first timers' speech at state conventions and thought, "one day... one day..." Now, I can say I did it and the experience was BEYOND MY EXPECTATIONS!
