## **Committee Reports:**

**S-T-R-E-T-C-H Workshop:** Mary Whitten reported on the second annual S-T-R-E-T-C-H Workshop at the Hutchinson Center, Belfast on March 17, 2018. There were 47 attendees with 3 no shows. Of the attendees, 40% were not members of DKG and 4 were men. There is a copy of the report in your folder. Finances: Receipts \$1600, Expenditures \$1427.81. The International Keynote Speaker was Dr. Slyvie Bastien-Doss. Please note next year's suggested date, March 16, 2019, Hutchinson Center. If you have any suggestions for next year's presenters please let her know. Also, if you have any suggestions for anyone who would like to be part of the next biennium, let her know.

**Legislative Update:** Crystal Ward informed us that there are 2 bills on the Appropriations Table. One is to raise the state contribution to insurance from 45% to 50% and 5% each year after. The second bill is for insurance companies to pay \$3000 for hearing aids. It is an election year, ask a lot of questions, elections have consequences, do your research and vote. Make wise choices.

**Publicity/Communication:** Kay Grindall introduced the new brochure. Make sure you have a supply to hand out to colleagues. Make them available in schools. There were 1000 copies made so take what you might need for your chapter.

**Chapter Histories:** Judy Gilbert is here to collect the chapter histories. **Finance Committee:** Melanie noted that there is a 6-page report in your folder. The items discussed at the meeting included 1) the trip to the Katahdin Woods and Waters, 2) the 75th Supreme Celebration where it was moved to spend \$7400 and Georgene came in under that amount, 3) to cover via the Roberta

Rogers fund Mary Hyland's deposit for the Leadership Management Seminar in Austin, Texas \$600, 4) to raise the scholarship amount to \$1000 with a bylaw change next year, 5) the great rate for the cost of the new brochure, 6) the registration cost for working chapters at convention, 7) to defray the cost for the State President's expenses and 8) a list was made to show where the money goes for the Roberta Rogers Fund and to continue to offer these items. The next part of the report concerns the proposed budget, which was approved by the Executive Board last night. The proposed budget results in estimated expenses of \$13,222.00, which is an increase of \$307.00 over last year. Subtracting the total estimated expenses of \$13,222 from the total estimated available income of \$28,614.87, we get \$691.97 less than 2017.

- President Elaine explained that there is some concern about Standing Rule, Banquet # 4 and is recommending a suspension of the rule for this year to be discussed next year. What is needed is a motion to suspend. It was moved last night at the Executive Board, but it is also needed from the members of the General Session. The motion was so moved by Rena Kearney and voted unanimously.
- President Elaine explained the proposed trip to Katahdin Woods and Waters for Alpha Psi Members on June 27,28. It is a 2-day trip; you can do one day or day two.
