



LEGISLATION AND ISSUES

Here are a few National Issues and Updates that will or are impacting our states:

Women, Peace and Security Act The House passed the Women, Peace, and Security Act (S. 1141), which prioritizes the involvement of women in the prevention and resolution of violent conflict. The bill now moves to the president's desk for signature.

DACA Department of Homeland Security Acting Secretary Elaine Duke earlier this week urged Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) recipients to renew their enrollment before yesterday's deadline. October 5 marked the last day current DACA enrollees could renew their status before the program ends as a result of President Donald Trump's executive order.



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Support of Affirmative Action A new poll from Pew Research Center found that Americans' support for affirmative action programs has increased in recent years. In 2017, 71 percent of respondents said programs "designed to increase the number of black and minority students on college campuses are a good thing," compared to 63 percent in 2014.

Three Legislative Bills to Note:

The Paycheck Fairness Act (S. 819/H.R. 1869)

The Equal Pay Act of 1963 prohibits pay discrimination on the basis of sex. It has narrowed the gender pay gap but AAUW reports that there is a need for an update to close existing loopholes, strengthen penalties for equal pay violations, prohibit

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retaliation against workers who voluntarily discuss or disclose their wages, and support data collection and research.

The Pay Equity for All Act (H.R. 2418) would ban employers from using salary history to determine future pay Banning this would prohibit employers from continuing the practice of unequal pay. Several states and Cities have passed legislation on this.

The Fair Pay Act (H.R. 2095) would curb occupational segregation. This bill would ensure equal pay for equal work in all occupations and industries.
